3. Land and Labour Acknowledgement

Chair Monico reads, "The Trent Central Student Association wishes to acknowledge that we are meeting today on the traditional territories of the Mississaugeeg Anishnaabeg people of Treaty 20 and the Williams Treaty, who have been taking care of this land since creation. As visitors to these lands, we would like to acknowledge the displacement and sacrifices of all Indigenous peoples who lived, learned and gathered here, much like we are today. Peterborough, or Nogojiwanong, as it was originally called, has become home to many, and we would like to recognize the contributions made by other First nations, Metis and Inuit peoples to this community. We give further thanks to the people of Curve Lake First Nation and Hiawartha First Nations for welcoming us onto this beautiful land. While settler-colonialism is still very evident within the structure of our society and institutions, the TCSA is committed to furthering the work of a de-colonial student union and campus, in partnership with Indigenous university staff, students, and community groups.

The Trent Central Student Association acknowledges that much of what we know of our society today, including its culture, economic growth, and development, has been made possible by the unpaid labour of Black, Indigenous, and Racialized peoples. While racism is prominent within the structure of our society and institutions, the TCSA is committed to furthering the work of an anti-racist student union and campus in partnership with Black, Indigenous, and Racialized university staff, students, and community groups."

4. Chairs Remarks

Chair Monico introduces himself as chair of the Board of Directors. He includes his favourite quote by Aldo Leopold, *"Think like a mountain"*, who was an ecologist in the 1970s, to highlight the importance of unity within the Association. He also speaks of the importance of seeing the university as a whole instead of parts and the portfolios of individual student leaders.

5. Approval of the Agenda

6. Approval of Minutes



MOTION: Be it resolved that the minutes from the March 11th, 2023 Special Board of Directors Meeting, the June 19th 2023 Summer Committee, and the August 13th 2023 Summer Committee meeting be approved with the necessary corrections.

7. Executive Reports

Vice President Zanzoul presents their executive report for the period of June to September. They highlighted the events that were held during the September Orientation week. These events included; the 'Welcome Bag' event, Sexual Health Trivia, Get the Tea on your Union and the 'Great Race' event. They outlined what the goal of each event was with regard to welcoming new students to the campus and introducing them to the Association. They also included the events that they assisted in planning and hosting the Tree Top Trekking event and are currently planning the Leadership Assembly and the Pumpkin Patch event in partnership with Macleans Berry Farms. Vice President Zanzoul outlined what training and committees they have been partaking in, as well as discussing the key meetings they have attended, including the CFS Annual General meeting, a PVP meeting and a Student Senate Caucus meeting.

Vice President Bodden presents their executive report and begins by announcing that they have been ratified into the Canadian Federation of Students with voting power between their last report and this one and attended the Ontario General meeting. They discussed the direction of CFS for the new year and what is planned for the upcoming National Day of Action on November 8th. This will be a day when students are taken to downtown Toronto to lobby the government with regard to tertiary education. They also attended various committee meetings. They informed the Board that they have secured a donation from Trent International to support the One Stop Chop Shop. Their up-coming events are the Pride Picnic on Wednesday, September 20th, 2023, and the Pride Parade on Saturda, September 23rd 2023. Vice President Bodden speaks further on PVP, and on the Hiring Committee they were appointed to for the hiring of a new Community Coordinator, which included doing interviews. They assisted in Orientation Week and touched on the training they attended.

Vice President Polichiccio, spoke on their two areas of focus that they brought to PVP; harm reduction and food insecurity. They discussed the Food Services Advisory Committee, and their role liaising with Mark Murdoch. They also highlighted the CFS Annual General meeting they attended, as well as other weekly meetings. Vice President Polichiccio speaks to the Tree Top Trekking event, which they organized for students to Treetop Trekking Ganaraska. They also presented the Board with their upcoming event, the Harm Reduction Fair, on September 26th, which will include the launch of the Party Safer kits. These kits will include items such as drink night caps, breathalyzer kits and informatio cards. They are organising the Head of the Trent



Community cleanup to minimize the impact of that weekend on the community. They highlighted their upcoming collaboration with Trent Health and Motion in bringing a nutritionist to campus for workshops on healthy meal planning. They concluded their report by highlighting the supporting role they played during Orientation Week.

Commissioner Nayler informs the Board that they will inform the OC college office of the Community clean up and also volunteers to be part of the event.

President Anctil begins by speaking about the creation of the Student Summer Transit Experience Survey in support of the work being done by the General Manager in the Transit Liaison committee. They plan on launching another survey to examine how service has continued into the fall. They spoke on the Demand Omnibus initiative and their meeting with President Leo Groarke, where they presented the results of the Excaliburnt Out survey. This campaign will also include a letter to the provincial government regarding; OSAP and the privatization of post-secondary education, amongst other issues. They discussed the training session they ran on recruitment and the HR work that will come out of concerns and issues that have come out of the student housing department. They include the work that they are doing with security at Traill College to enhance their overnight security. They are also working on a set of policies for an upcoming Student Staff Union. They spoke on the committees that they sit on, including the Student Issues Caucus and the Student Centre Committee. President Anctil spoke about the lockers that are going to be installed outside of the TCSA office. Commissioner Nayler stated that they would prefer the expansion of the Student Centre in favour of the creation of a new building.

MOTION: Be it resolved that the Board of Directors accept the Executive Reports.

8. Elections

Resource Manager Walker informs the Board that elections are underway. They have been doing outreach events as the nomination period opened on September 5th. They have received a lot of interest in the open positions. Nominations are open until September 29th. Campaigning will happen for two weeks. The voting period will be from October 9th to 13th, 2023. The 'Meet the Candidates' event will tentatively be held on October 5th. The ratification will be on October 15th. Resource Manager Walker also added that they are willing to assist cabinets in their elections, in the form of a resource, in response to a statement from Prime Minister Edwards, who informed the Board that the LEC Commissioner position on the Board is still vacant. The Brand Ambassador team is currently promoting the elections at the Promotions desk to facilitate outreach.

9. Committees

Resource Manager Walker requests that directors sign up for the remaining committees with unfilled seats. President West requested that all the committees be named before any of the



directors are assigned their seats, and began by naming the committees that are within Trent. Prime Minister Edwards recommends that the Vice President of Campaigns and Equity or another equity commissioner sit on the Student Charter of Rights and Responsibilities committee as the Charter is being reviewed this year. Vice President Bodden clarifies to the Board that the Executives have already signed up for committees that are within their schedules, and hence, if they did not sign up for a committee that may fall within their portfolio, they have class at that time.

The Trent committee assignments are as follows;

The Teaching and Learning Advisory Committee filled by President Johnston,

Cyclical Program Review Committee filled by President Johnston,

The Research Policy Committee filled by GC Commissioner Rajgor,

The Operations and Marketing committee under Food Services filled by Vice President Polichiccio,

The Food Services Budget working group filled by Vice President Policicchio,

Catering for Food Services filled by President West,

The Campus Card committee filled by Commissioner Carter,

The International Scholarship Fund committee filled by Commissioner Khawar,

The Student Charter of Rights and Responsibilities committee filled by Commissioner Lariviere,

The Co-curricular Record Committee filled by President West, and

The Campus Fair Trade Steering Committee filled by President Johnston.

Resource Manager Walker also outlines the need for directors to sign up for internal TCSA committees, the assignments are as follows;

Three directors for the Finance committee filled by Vice President Policicchio, Commissioner Khawar and Commissioner Carter,

A representative of Traill College to sit on the Transportation committee filled by President Cooke, and

Three directors for the Benefits Committee filled by Commissioner Khawar, Commissioner Carter and Commissioner Rajgor

Resource Manager Walker also emphasized that once new directors are elected, they will also be assigned committees, and hence, these are not permanent assignments yet.



MOTION: Be it resolved that the Board approve all 2023/2024 term committee appointments.

MOVED: Vice President Polichiccio moves, Commissioner Khawar seconds Motion carries with one abstention

10. Transit

Prime Minister Edwards speaks to the transit report that was recently released, stating that Peterborough Transit will be keeping the current route network currently being used. They are not going to be returning to the hub-and-spokes network and are ending the contract with the On-Demand service provider in October. They will be returning to regular evening routes as of then. They are also going to be restoring funding to their reserves, as well as using money towards more buses, a new garage and multiple other short-term goals, including paper maps being available. Furthermore, it was also outlined that Peterborough Transit are hiring to allow for half-hourly service between 8 am to 5 pm, Monday through Friday.

Prime Minister Edward went on to speak about the high demand for transit during the week, and the lack of understanding of bus etiquette by the general public, which has caused issues in people receiving service, and how that can be addressed through social media advocacy.

General Manager Milne informs the board that they are still sitting on the Peterborough Transit committee. The committee met five times over the summer to create recommendations for City Council on how to improve the ridership, as that was the primary concern of the Council. The recommendations were approved by a subcommittee and are going to the City Council for approval on the 25th. General Manager Milne outlined that the Transit Committee concluded that the only way to increase the ridership was to invest more into the current system to ensure its stability. Beyond the 25th, the committee will continue to meet to continue making recommendations to solidify and improve the grid system as it is. The Association is going to prepare a letter for the 25th in support of the recommendations. It was also noted that the ridership of Peterborough Transit is up by 53% in comparison to the last year, which is a positive sign.

General Manager Milne also spoke about the application submitted for federal and provincial capital funding by the city in order to fund the building of a proper bus terminal or turnaround at Trent, and further updates will be provided. This initiative is to allow for a safer and more cohesive way to navigate the Bata Loop and to allow the drivers a space where they can comfortably take their breaks. Furthermore, the union for the drivers are negotiating with the city for a contract for drivers who are filing for conciliation. General Manager Milne summarizes that a strike is very unlikely to occur and that many of the concerns of the drivers' union have been met. However, they included that should a strike happen, there would be little that Trent and the TCSA could do. There would be a way to provide some support, but it would not deliver the same amount of service, and it would also jeopardize the position of Trent and the TCSA with the drivers union.



Prime Minister Edwards wants to include that the Board of Directors also wants to include a gesture of support to the letter being sent to City Council. General Manager Milne also notes that Peterborough Transit lost eight drivers who are not being replaced until September, but they also note that Transit is planning on having a complete staff of drivers by October.

In closing, Prime Minister Edwards adds that whilst supporting the drivers union through the Thank You campaign in the previous year was positive, an even more positive way to show our support to them would be by supporting their labour negotiations with the City and Peterborough Transit.

General Manager Milne adds that the Transit committee is going to be using the survey constructed in part by President Anctil to inform future recommendations. They also noted that, in order to ensure that the recommendations reach the City Council, they concentrated on the budget, but will now be able to shift the focus from the budget to ensuring that Trent students are better supported, and are open to suggestions.

Motion: Be it resolved that the board of directors support in principle the recommendations in City Report IPSTR23-004.

MOVED: Prime Minister Edwards motions, President Johnston seconds. Motion carries unanimously.

11. Any Other Business

Resource Manager Walker mentions that the year is very busy, particularly with elections underway. The majority of the staff at the TCSA are new this year and are settling into their roles. The new hires included the new Community Coordinator, Aditi Sharma, who recently organized Clubs and Groups Day and Vendors Day. Resource Manager Walker also spoke on the planning of the Leadership Assembly which is taking place on the 23rd of September, which is a training day for clubs on campus, as well as further hiring for a Front Desk Staff position.

Resource Manager Walker also read the Services Manager update, which included the purchasing of a new deep freezer for the One Stop Chop Shop, as there have been an average of 20 to 30 appointments per week. There will be a new fridge purchased for the pantry as well, which will arrive by reading week. The Wrapped 'n' Ready program is going well, and students are using the dispensers in the bathrooms frequently. With regards to benefits, this is currently the opt-out period, and it ends on September 30th. Anyone with further questions about benefits can contact Services Manager Litow-Daye or General Manager Milne.

Prime Minister Edwards wanted to acknowledge the Jewish Holiday Rosh Hashanah, which takes place during the weekend.

Events/Advocacy

Peterborough Transit

- Summer Transit Experience survey created with the General Manager. During August this collected information about underserviced areas. This survey supported advocacy efforts within the Transit Liaison committee. Pending the City Council meeting on August 25th, the current system will be kept with no service reductions. On-Demand service may be removed. New drivers and staff will be recruited to address gaps in service.

Demand Omnibus

- Met with President Leo G. on August 14th, The PVP meeting was organized in collaboration with Lawerence L. Hosted on August 21st, discussing results of Excaliburnt Out survey, executive proposals, and introduction of Demand Omnibus. Agreement from Sr. Administration to support letter to Provincial government regarding privatization of post-secondary education, OSAP, and more.

Recruitment Training Session

- On August 16th, hosted a session for Trent's Recruitment team on the TCSA's services, advocacy, and organizational structure.

Student Housing Department

- On August 29th, confirmation of therapist in residence, EAP Buy-in, and water testing for all residence facilities. The department is working on setting up listening sessions for current and former student staff regarding HR incidents and concerns. Student Staff Employment policies have been compiled by HR. Training session on issue escalation (discrimination, harassment, sexual violence, etc.) Working on enhancing Traill security.

Student Staff Union

- In the process of creating a Student Staff Union. Outreach and creation of policy guidebooks ongoing. Several consultation meetings with interested parties and campus unions.

Committees

Student Issues Caucus

- Held on August 13th, discussed logistics of Student Staff Union and focus areas. Transit recommendations. Demand Omnibus recruitment for revision.

Student Centre Committee

- The committee met on August 23rd. Confirmed the lockers position and wudu stations, and set for approval by the SPACE committee. Requested bus monitors for live updates at Bata Loop and Gzowski. Requested accessibility check with support from CPD. Discussed Transit hub and pharmacy. Notification that Peer Support rooms are being used by Careerspace and Spiritual Affairs.
