3. Land and Labour Acknowledgement

Chair Walker read, "The Trent Central Student Association wishes to acknowledge that we are meeting today on the traditional territories of the Mississaugeeg Anishnaabeg people of Treaty 20 and the Williams Treaty, who have been taking care of this land since creation. As visitors to these lands, we would like to acknowledge the displacement and sacrifices of all Indigenous peoples who lived, learned and gathered here, much like we are today. Peterborough, or Nogojiwanong, as it was originally called, has become home to many, and we would like to recognize the contributions made by other First nations, Metis and Inuit peoples to this community. We give further thanks to the people of Curve Lake First Nation and Hiawartha First Nations for welcoming us onto this beautiful land. While settler-colonialism is still very evident within the structure of our society and institutions, the TCSA is committed to furthering the work of a de-colonial student union and campus, in partnership with Indigenous university staff, students, and community groups.

The Trent Central Student Association acknowledges that much of what we know of our society today, including its culture, economic growth, and development, has been made possible by the unpaid labour of Black, Indigenous, and Racialized peoples. While racism is prominent within



the structure of our society and institutions, the TCSA is committed to furthering the work of an anti-racist student union and campus in partnership with Black, Indigenous, and Racialized university staff, students, and community groups"

6. Executive Updates

President Anctil informs directors of the creation of a demand omnibus, which is being created with Trent's other unions, TGSA, TDSA, CUPE and TUFA. These demands will be presented to the administration. They have also been assisting the VPUC with Orientation Week planning. They are meeting with VP Julie Davis and AVP Students Lawrence Lam to discuss transit and have been continuing conversations to ensure service for September. President Anctil has also created an events calendar to help minimize overlap between Association and College events.

VP Zanzoul announces this year's Orientation Week events. The Association will be doing its annual welcome bags as well as Sexy Trivia, Get the Tea on Your Union and the Great Race. They have also been working with OC Commissioner Jonathan Nayler to write a letter in support of increased compensation and training for Orientation Week leaders. Prime Minster Edwards asks for clarification on the Get the Tea event. VP Zanzoul explains that students will get free bubble tea and be able to chat with the Executive team and other Association staff about services and the resources TCSA offers.

VP Bodden has been planning multiple events for Peterborough Pride in September, including the Pride Picnic and letting students walk in the parade with the Association banner. They have also been working with Commissioner Scanga on a divestment letter and OC Commissioner Nayler to support Orientation Week leaders. She has been planning a campaign for this Fall called The Call is Coming from in the House, which will address student experiences at Trent, with a focus on International Students, Tuition costs and Student support services. They have also been working with VPHW to create grocery shopping and price-matching resources for students. Prime Minister Edwards asks how the June Pride trip to Toronto went. VP Bodden explained that despite some students getting lost, the overall trip was a success and heard lots of good feedback. VP Bodden will also be reviewing Trents flag policy as they don't fly a Pride flag in June and don't fly an Every Child Matters flag in September.

VP Policchico has been planning a harm reduction fair for September in partnership with local community organizations. This will also include Naloxone and overdose recognition training for students. She has also been creating party-safe kits, which will include one-time use breathalizers, drug testing coasters, nightcaps and other resources. These will be given to



students at the Harm Reduction fair ahead of HOTT weekend. She is also hoping to start a mixed-ability varsity sports league for students to increase student involvement, especially for students who are injured or have mobility restrictions. VP Policchico will also be hosting a Tree Top Trekking event this Tuesday for students.

7. Lockers

MOTION: Be it resolved that Summer Committee approve the contract with Signifi and the addition of a budget line for annual software/licensing costs.

President Anctil presents to directors an automated locker system the Association is hoping to get. With the increasing number of student services the Association offers, we are looking for new ways to make them more accessible to students. These lockers would be used for remote pick up either outside of the Association's office hours or if students would like increased privacy. Students will be able to pick up prescriptions, merch orders, One Stop Chop, Wrapped and Ready, and keys for room booking. Once they've placed an order, students receive an individual one-time-use QR code that only opens the locker. The lockers are built custom and will include TCSA-specific branding. TCSA will also have access to 24/7 tech support and annual maintenance. President Anctil is also hoping to receive sponsorships from Trents Colleges to assist with the one-time investment costs. The lockers take 2 months for production, so the Services manager, Zoe, is hoping for them to be installed during the Fall reading week.

8. Any Other Business

Prime Minister Edwards informs directors that LEC's Commissioner has resigned so they will be filling this position in their Fall byelection
