# Performative Allyship vs. Productive Allyship

#### Performative

This is a form of allyship can become <u>harmful</u> toward communities the ally is <u>intending to help</u>.

For example, this could look like reposting social media <u>without</u> any intended <u>action</u> to <u>back up</u> this post.

This sort of allyship is meant more to be boosting the moral appearance of the ally <u>rather than truly helping</u> anyone. Allyship is <u>action</u>, not merely vocalization.

#### Productive

This form of allyship looks like <u>listening</u> to others and giving those with diverse intersectional backgrounds a <u>platform</u> to speak out if they wish to.

<u>Amplifying others</u> can look like <u>empowerment. Recognizing</u> things that are <u>important to their diverse</u> <u>background.</u> For example, <u>recognizing</u> <u>particular months, holidays or days</u> is an act of <u>solidarity</u> which can make others <u>feel accepted and seen</u> within your community.

It can also look like <u>taking</u> certain <u>outdated terminology</u> or <u>colonial phrases</u> <u>out</u> of your <u>diction</u>. Thank you for taking the time to read this, scan the QR code to save a copy for future reference
